These are some of the men who graduated on February 7, 2012. Many were not available for the photo. Joining John, Eileen, and Charlie Coriell as teaching volunteers is Phil Esposito. Phil has a long experience with Little Lambs and has a burning desire to teach the word. Phil and his wife Ruth volunteered with us when we first came to Sebring and worked out of our home. Ruth has continued these almost 14 years as our office computer expert! She works every Tuesday and oversees the data input. We welcome Phil and are excited for his opportunity to pour into the men.





I think one of the most striking things to see is the change in the men and women when we do the class on verbal and emotional abuse. They seldom realize how their words have the power to destroy their wives and marriages. They do not see themselves as 'abusers' because they may not have hit anyone and it is a revelation to discover that they may have been very abusive!

From Prison: What have I learned in this class?

What I've learned from family and marriage class is that my marriage is unhealthy. I've learned that my wife and I do not respect each other. There are no boundaries in my marriage. We are both codependent people. She is a giver and I am a taker. I've also learned that I am unhappy. I am unhappy but I am not ready for a divorce. I know that the unhappiness in my marriage is because of my actions. I have put my wife through so much abuse, physical, mental, emotional, sexual), hurt and more. I've learned in this class a few lessons on how to salvage what's left so it can be built on. Keep me in your prayers please. Freemel

Why am I taking Overcomers Class?

Because I have been involved in AA and NA, and substance abuse programs, worked with a sponsor, and applied what I learned, I decided I did not need another class. But as the days passed I thought about what I was telling myself and the Holy Spirit opened my eyes to the fact that just because I know "the formula" of how to be an overcomer, does not necessarily make me one! When I do a true inventory of myself, I see I am not the overcomer I believe myself to be. Sure, I have had victory over many of my addictions for many years now. Yet in reality, I still have struggles and fall prey to my selfish desires. Am I an overcomer 100% of the time? No way! Do I always overcome the devil by the blood of the Lamb and the word of my testimony? Honestly, outside of Christ, ND WAY! Can I truly say 100% of the time that I love not my life unto death? NO! If there is one thing that I have learned about me is that I cannot rely on yesterdays victories to determine my victories of today. Because every day my flesh cries out for more. My pride swells with past victories as if I did anything myself. My faults multiply and become transparent in the light of my denials.

So I thank God right now for opening my eyes just enough to recognize I am not all I think I am sometimes. Pride, lust, greed, gluttony, self-indulgent, and selfishness are always knocking at my door and I regularly crack the door open to allow small amounts to come in at a time, forgetting that a little leaven leavens the whole lump. Or thinking I can hide it or handle it until the truth blows it all up in my face and I'm left stunned and asking, "What happened?" I look forward to growing with this course. Dale

Ruth Esposito and Judith Helping us to grade are Pauline Chabert and Brenda King. These things are so necessary for us as John is

experiencing some difficulties with his back. He will be seeing a neurosurgeon to see if they can help resolve some of his problems.
