Just this week we had a young woman come in to work with our volunteers just for the day while she waited for me. She sat with our volunteers and did whatever she was told and was filled

in about our system at the office, the bible studies, and all the minute details that go into our program by our volunteers that day. It truly is hands on and time intensive. Later in speaking to her, she said, **"How long have these people done this? They really like what they do."** 

How do you explain the love of God that is shed abroad in our hearts to enable us to love others, even sacrificially? Every time a letter comes into the office, especially the graduate thank you letters, I am again overwhelmed with the work God has called us to do. Our volunteers labor in silence, yet it is a magnificent work. It is one on one discipleship with the inmates. Seldom loved men and women are made to feel loved and accepted, and even eager to learn about the Lord. Their stories are filled with pain and shame, yet knowing God is healing them. We print, pack lessons, grade, fold, weigh, tape, box, cut and fold, sign cards, put labels, log students into the computer, open mail, catalog it, read letters asking for a lesson, grade some more, print self addressed stamped envelopes, send out new student packs, wrap bibles, get out these news-letters, write letters, pray, counsel, teach, answer questions, and send parents requests. We are consistent. We are always there. And we love what we do! We change lives. And I might add that some of those 'people' have done this for more than 12 years now at Little Lambs! And they give to see that the studies keep coming. One student said,

"The Spirit of God has placed upon my heart to write this letter of gratitude to you guy's to let you know that you are greatly appreciated. Here in prison, I seldom watch the news or TV at all. But when I do, I here how bad the economy is out there. But I see, through the grace of God you guy's (The School) have been keeping your heads above water, because these lessons continue to come in (Praise God!) So speaking for other fellow-inmates who are taking this course, and myself, we thank you so much for your time and devotion, and, yes, we do give God the glory! This lesson on sexual holiness has been like a sermon to me. It has enlighten me in understanding the first five books of the bible a lot better now. And it makes me take fornication much more seriously now. I think a lot of churches needs to be sent this lesson. Someone asked, do we ever do any follow up. Just this week's 'follow up.' Gary, three years with us and living in Wichita now, sent us a photo with his 4 year sobriety chip. Gary's life was totally changed, went home and restored family relationships, and is now working to bring recovery and God into different facilities. He loves Little Lambs and all of you and stays in touch. One of our young

ladies who came through the Boundaries program was pinned this week as a Graduate Practical Nurse. She stopped by, so excited for her future. We are extremely proud of her steadfastness to continue her studies in spite of hard circumstances. Another letter from one of our prison graduates who came to Sebring for more recovery with us. He has since gone home to New York and writes often with thanks. He is helping care for his mother with Alzheimer's, attends meetings, church, and speaks occasionally at meetings.


