The purpose of our women's home is to provide long term recovery for women. Their mind must be renewed, educated, inspired and transformed. This takes time, focus, energy, and lots of love. We expect our residents to spend from 6 months to a year with us, depending on the severity of their problems. Because of this confusion with 'the Safe House' we will be changing our name. But work goes on and we are being blessed every day by the Lord's provision and His grace and mercy. He has placed the burden for this



home on the hearts of many in our community who have joined us in our mission. Left is Bill Dailey, an old friend. Bill has completed the cabinetry for us and it's installation. Above right, is the cross that Ray has worked into the tile in the showers for the ladies. Another gift of grace has been Greg Carr. Greg, possibility for all our painting. He has done a terrific job. A professional painter

and his helper Brian, have taken responsibility for all our painting. He has done a terrific job. A professional painter, he has donated all his time and efforts. We don't have to call Greg, he is here and working. The work is beautiful and now complete. It is looking like home. The tiling is progressing, leading to installation of the bathroom fixtures.



We have a façade grant of \$1,500 from the CRA to help with the exterior renovation. Still needed is help with the lawn and the driveway, and the air conditioning. Helen, our community liaison, is working to have major fundraising events in the fall and winter to eliminate debt and raise operating funds. He remembered John as a young Christian in prison and John remembered him when he identified himself. Mr. Prieto, below right, pointed out another Correctional Officer in the mall who also remembered John. Below, center, is Mr. Socalas. Both men were edified in knowing the work still being done by an inmate that they had a part in helping through the system. Another guard from John's time in prison is Jerry White, below with John. Jerry is in John's book. He was the first one to give John a song tape in prison and suggest that he learn how to sing with



music tracks. John did and the rest is history. Jerry lives in Avon Park with his wife and continues to sing at churches and other venues with a gospel trio. Although he has many health challenges, he continues to share the gos-

pel through song. It was said at the time that there was a revival taking place in Avon Park Prison (the early eighties). That revival played a great role in John's life and ministry. In fact, several of the men in prison with John went into the ministry when they left prison.

Unfortunately, many have since died. PS, We could use some help with trim carpentry! Although we have received over \$30,000 in donated labor and materials and we are doing the a/c ourselves to keep costs down, we need financial help. Air conditioning....\$5600
