need of our help and prayers.



She will be traveling to the east coast for medical opinions this week. Eileen Sarracino is also dealing with an acute problem in her back. Our dear Evangeline Johnson is

recovering from a shoulder replacement. Delora Christian, with us for many years, has a medical problem. We ask you to please pray for their healing and return to the ministry.

By the same token, we are looking for new volunteers. Our office staff remains constant, but our need is for more graders. Kelli, from Grace Place, has been trained and is now serving as our new-student volunteer on Fridays. She takes all the new requests and sends them the new student packages. She has also been helping us send information packets to the individual chaplains at the state prisons. We have mailed out introduction letters and

studies to over 15 states' chaplains with posters that can be posted in the chapels. We have seen a big increase in new students since we started this. This new increase means we need new graders!!! The Chaplains are making good use of our materials. A Chaplain in California has returned 13 first lessons from inmates at his own cost. Dear Family in Christ , I am currently at HCDC Facility (County Jail) waiting to go to the RSAT Program at Alto, Ga. RSAT is a Residential Substance Abuse Treatment for probationers. Thankfully another inmate gave me your address last month and I received my initial package with the first lesson. Last week, my parents mailed me a Bible Study from home but instead of the study, the jail enclosed a note in the envelope that states "As of April 10, no more religious material from anybody and companies." After speaking with the chaplain, she confirmed that no religious materials will be given to inmates via mail. At visitation I informed my family and they are concerned that Bibles will be the next to go. This is a reminder to me that the end times are closer than we think. Please keep us in your prayers. I look forward to receiving your lessons again when I transfer to the treatment program. Love, Rachael

Our last class to graduate Avon Park Prison Overcomers Addiction Recovery Graduate:

My name is Benson and I'm an alcoholic. Understand-

ing I had a drinking problem was difficult being I was filled with pride. Plus the effects allowed me to be rid of all my fears and anxieties. "Knowing"? at the time I could quit at any time I wanted, I said no problems. Then came the time where my embarrassments became legal mishaps, but still with my Stinkin Thinkin, I could control it. In fact, I could control anything. I had become my own god. Finally I reached a point where I accepted my problem, but still thought I could do it on my own. As I brought myself to the brink of suicide, I was so determined I thought if I just had a constant reminder, something to prove I needed to stop drinking. So before suicide, I'll cut my finger off. Yes, that would do it. One month later I committed the crime that put me where I am today. Thinking I was hopeless I planned to kill myself once I got out of county jail. Through my trial I was found guilty of all the charges I did. This I was not disputing and given time served. Then I was found guilty of one charge I did not do, sentencing me to prison! With knowing my sentence could have been much worse I've realized God has given me these times to get my life in order and my head straight with my persons, places, things and situations. I have accepted Jesus Christ as my Savior and through the steps of recovery I'm learning a new way of life. Through my tribulations I've learned God has a sense of humor and I seem to be the butt of the joke:). Time has proven things can be better as patience seems to be an issue.

Dear Partners,

We want to update you about our termite situation. So many thanks to those of you who helped and those who wished they could help! Your response encouraged us so much. The Family of God also stepped up and one of our ministry partners called in help from their own termite man, also a Christian who gives back in prisons and jails, and before a few days were up we had treatment with less than half the cost. Ken Ayler's Once-A-Year Termite and Pest Control from Lakeland came out and not only took care of our the termites, but did pest control on the entire house and yard including fertilizer for the same cost. We have made a great new friend in the Lord. Their slogan is "Have a blessed and bug free day!"
