Dear John & Eileen,

A we were broken hearted spiritually dead woman living in sin. Tired of being tired and wanting to die I got on my hands and knees out in a yard with inmates walking around and I surrendered my life to the Lord and rededicated my life to him. I am now going to the Protestant Church Services at every chance I get. I'm also going to AA and NA meetings. April 3, I quit taking a very powerful anti-psychotic medication called Navane. I took it for 25 years. Unable to cope, I am now taking another anti-psychotic. My therapist told me that when my faith grows so big and I am totally filled with the spirit then I will be able to get off the meds. I still feel weak. Time only friends that I have is Jesus, and my family. Now that I am in God's tender care once again I believe that I am on the right path and with his guidance he will get me out of here. I have been here 16 years and I don't want to die in here. I have 3 adult kids and 3 small grand kids and parents that are still alive. I very much desire to be a part of their lives. Please help. I need your Bible Studies. I am trying to do what is right but I need some help. Barbara, Ca

Dear Salas, I am 25 years old and now I am on my way to prison. I've been sentenced to 8 years and 5 years to run concurrently. I've been in jail going on 8 months. I spent the first 6 months in another jail away from home. Now that I have been sentenced I'm back in my home town. I'm around everybody I can say I know. We all do our best to stick together and we have a bible study every night before we lay down our heads. I read this pamphlet I found laying beside my bed and that's why I'm writing. I would like to start receiving anything you have that will help me further or should I say help me and the fella's with our bible study. We are in a bad, well old and run down jail where we have it rough. But I believe the bible I read gets me by every day. Please pray for all of us inmates in the County Jail. Opie, Ok

Dear Mr. And Mrs. Sala, I got your present you sent me. The Bible is beautiful. I've never had a bible like this before. It's almost undeserving. I'm not worth such a niceness. Thank you so much. ## Marriage, Family, & Parenting Graduation Essays 2013

**I really enjoyed the class a lot** and I learned a lot about dysfunctional family. I really enjoyed learning about the love tanks and the role God plays in our lives. I never knew there were some many boundary until I took the class. I hope that you keep teaching the class and help others like me....

The part of this course that has affected me the most is the entire model dealing with codependency. I now realize that most of my past relationships have been codependent and totally unhealthy.

I found it disturbing to find myself and a lot of my character traits described in detail. Now, through this course, I have been forced to face that reality. I am learning to deal with this issue. I have learned to stand back, separate myself and analyze not only my motives but also motives of others I am involved with.

I've learned that to avoid becoming entangled in codependent relationhsips I must first be able to live comfortably by and with myself and the Lord. I have to rely on the Lord above all others and feel his love for me and my self-worth in his eyes. Without knowing and feeling his love I can't love another. No one on this earth can fulfill my needs like the Glory of God can, will and does.

Now that I see and accept his Grace and Love I am no longer dependent on others for validation of my worth or love. I come from a multi-generational family of addicts and codependency and like any cycle can and will be broken with me through seeing the problem and through the process of detachment becoming free of these codependent relationships. I can now apparently accept my part in the negative outcome of past unhealthy relationships and avoid the same pitfalls in the future. I can analyze past failures, see why they failed and hold myself accountable to God and his wishes for my life. In summation, this area of the class is the one I needed the most and will prove to have the biggest life-change for me.

Key to Life is a living relationship with Jesus the Christ, my own. Dependent on me, no one else. I can change me not others, but if I'm right with God than I can impact others but only God and themselves can change them. My boundaries are set by God's word only and how I see myself and others from God's word will dictate how I treat them. My wife cannot give me peace or make me happy or fulfill me, nor can I do that for her. If we both love Jesus then we can love one another. Our boundaries should be the same and we should be able to raise healthy, successful children, who in turn should love God, find another person who does also and so on and so on. We both came from broken youth's, early years with the same type of abuse and I see how that has affected the rest of my life. It's been there but we don't realize how it moves us, affects us, why we react the way we do, or even do the things we do. So we repress and suppress but this hidden 'hurt', it affects us and our actions and we may well be blind to it. So we must forgive others, take responsibility for our actions, confess them, ask for forgiveness, move on, not live in the past, NAIL IT TO THE CROSS, and leave it. So we change our core beliefs about our selves and the world, break the cycle of our addiction. We learn boundaries, good ones, we detach if necessary, from people and their problems; grow and change and teach others. We have changed and let them see over time we can be trusted and faithful. I have left your class feeling down and depressed when you speak of the past and got home, not wanting to come back. I must finish what I started and God has given me a soft heart but I'm stuck to finish this. When you speak to us remember our situation and the pressure and strain we are under. Hear, thank you so much Sister, God uses you in a great way. Thanks again.



Taking this class has really opened my eyes to living with boundaries and not needing some ones love to the point where I become dependent upon that person instead of God. I also learned to stay away from partners that do drugs or alcohol as that is a bad situation waiting to happen.

I wish I would have had this knowledge about relationships many years ago as it would have saved me many days of trouble. In the end I have learned how to rely on God more than any one person as you cannot make someone care or love you if they don't. Thank you for this class. If I could attend this type of class again I would.

It has blessed me immensely in my walk today.

Who knows everything is subject to change and God is good all the time. May God bless you and your ministry.
