A LIVING WITNESS

Every month we keep all the interesting and moving letters to share with you. At the end of the month, I go through them and select what we will share. It seems that we are getting many more letters. This month as I read the letter on the next page, my spirit soared. As you can guess the prison system in Wisconsin is not sunny Florida. It is a hard system. The letter writer is in a 'super max' prison, meaning the most maximum security, a harsh place for violent criminals. You are placed alone in a cell 23 hours a day with nothing to take your mind off



your sins and regrets and with very dangerous criminals. The writer tells us that there are frequent suicides and attempted suicides. Men destroying themselves rather than face life as it is. Hopeless as Ephesians says: *That at that time they were without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope, and without God in the world: Eph 2:12*

Yet, at some time before this man came to this cell, it was occupied by another inmate. An inmate who had found hope and a future in Christ no matter the situation. This man was enrolled in the Little Lambs School of the Bible. Knowing the torment of these places, this man decided to help his fellow man find God as he had. So he simply wrote on the wall of the cell, "Write to this address if your ever need help from someone." Then he included the address for Little Lambs Inc. We don't know how many men came to that cell before our friend. We don't know how many were saved because of this one man's faith, but what we do know is that this man, unsure of himself, unsure of us, unsure of the writer of the message, confused, alone, pondered at least a month about what to do. Finally he gave in and used his last envelope to write to this address! Now he has become a Little Lamb! But now in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us; Having abolished in his flesh the enmity, even the law of commandments contained in ordinances; for to make in himself of twain one new man, so making peace; And that he might reconcile both unto God in one body by the cross, having slain the enmity thereby. Eph 2:13-16

I often say that it doesn't matter how long a student is with us, each and every contact is important to the Lord. Every word that leaves this building is on a mission to testify of Jesus and his love for us! Every student has a mission to spread this hope to others. This is happening quietly throughout the prison and jail systems. So think about that man who occupied that cell. He left a living witness, and undying witness to the lost that will follow him. Pray for him and for every one who enters that cell. May the Holy Spirit inhabit those words to convince the men to write to our address. We will send bibles, lessons, postage. All that they need to learn about a loving Savior.

At the same time I am greatly humbled to be used in such a way by our loving Savior. That He would trust us to reach the lost in this way. Few people know what we do, we are a well kept secret! Except for the post office! We had a letter come all the way from a California prison without our address but it was a student writing us to enroll and the post office delivered that letter all the way from Ca.! Alleluia! Our God reigns! Pray, Pray, Pray

Dear John & Eileen, thank you for your ministry. I so deeply appreciate your studies' ability to keep me focused on the Word. This has been a journey for me and I thank you for your parts in my maturation.

You are so correct, as you state in your graduation letter, that this is just the beginning of my journey. Though I have been a nominal Christian most of my life, my time in prison has given me the time to draw very close to our Creator. I'm not sure I would have ever reached such intimacy with God had it not been for this time. There simply are not words enough to thank you for your coming beside me and guiding me. Your crowns are assured!

I lastly want to confirm for you that the 'gift' Bible arrived this week. It is very beautiful and will be used on my daily walk. Again, your work is precious and I thank you both from the bottom of my heart. Now it's my turn to spread the Word! Michael CO

my name is Rodney. I'm from Tampa, FL. I am 24 years old doing time in Madison, Wi. I bet you are wondering how did I get your address and I stay all the way in Madison, Wisconsin. Well truth be told I'm in a new Max Prison called Green Bay Correctional . I been locked up

since Dec 15, 2015, in a cell 23 hours a day. A lot of guys here do suicidal things to themselves and they are hurting themselves or they kill themselves up here and that's been going on a lot since I been here at this prison. But I found your address on a prison wall on the side my cell that I'm in right now. I been in this cell for a month now and I'm just writing to this address and the reason why it took me so long to write to this address because I did not know if it was the right address or the wrong address because when I saw the address on the wall it said write to this address if you ever **need help from someone** and I thought it was the wrong address and right now I still think its the wrong address because a lot of guys here just write on walls and say anything to pass time away. But as I sat in this cell longer I begin to ask myself and think to myself should I write to this address because I did not want to waste a stamped envelope for nothing and it was my last one for right now but I decided to write to this address anyway and if I did write to the right address thank you for taking the time of day to read this letter because I really need someone to pray for me because at this moment I do not have no one to reach out to not even my own family at this moment and I been going through so much since I been here and it's really getting me to the point I just do not know what to do any more so please just take the time out to just pray for me that's all I ask for and thank you very much.

Very moved by this letter, we sent Rodney a bible, a lesson and a letter. Please do pray for him.

Dearest Brother John and Sister Eileen,

I just finished reading your life story in the book, "I'm Not Coming Back", and I feel moved to write to you in hopes of a couple of blessings. First, I would like to tell you some of what is similar to our stories. I was born to alcoholic parents, who eventually split up. We went with my mother, but my father (who had friends and connections in law enforcement) came to where we were hiding and forcibly took us from my Mother. "Big Joe Larson" allowed no one to get the better of him in any situation and so after physically and violently taking my sister and I, brought us back to live with him. He died a short time later of cancer and sclerosis of the liver. I have often said it's a good thing because one of us would have eventually killed the other! He could be very vicious and abusive. My father was Loyal Order of Moose and we were sent to a private Moose orphanage. Ofter losing contact with my sister over 30 years ago, I fell into a life of drug addiction and have struggled over the past 30+ years with this affliction and consequently been in and out of jails and prison. Five years ago I said the Sinners Prayer right here in Clay County Jail and have felt a calling over the last few years. One more similarity I wish to mention is that affirmation comes to me daily thru other young and old inmates who tell me they are drawn to speak with me about their questions and curiosities of faith in Jesus Christ. I must admit, I am overwhelmed and humbled at the same time by their statements and I am also not sure how to handle the blessings. I am not well versed in scripture. I would welcome any and all advice, bible studies, tools you might have for me. John, Mo

Dear Partners,

As time goes flying by, we try to stay ahead of it. Our biggest news is that postal rates have gone down! An average piece of mail has decreased by 10 to 12 cents each! What a blessing as we mail hundreds of pieces a

month. This will certainly help our bottom line. Another big blessing is that our bible partner has decided not to retire just yet! We will continue buying bibles on a regular basis and stocking up on them. I believe we are graduating about 15 men and women a month. God is so good and answers prayer!

We are preparing for a decrease in graders because so many of us use the summer to visit friends and family. Because of this, most of us will doing double duty. Left is Roe McAdams. Roe has been grading for us for about 6 months and we are so glad to have him. Monie Motis delivers all our lessons to SIM for grading and she will be on vacation about a month too. She is trying to

make arrangements to cover SIM while she's gone. But nevertheless, it will get done.

The Board of Directors for Little Lambs Inc. met this month for the annual meeting. We are so grateful for this devoted friends and co-workers: Charles Coriell, Charlotte Heston, Hap Stephenson, Jan Ryan serve with me, Eileen. We continue to support Hogar Resa at Grace Place as well as several benevolent causes. Although donations have decreased through these years of recession, we remain committed to make the most of every cent received. And we want to thank all of you for your continued support this year. We

are so blessed to represent you before the Lord. And our students thank you as seen in all their letters! Below: Martha Giller has graduated yet another program at Hernando Correctional Institution. Congratulations!

I have a confession to make. I have been lax in vigorously brushing my hair! Once when I prayed for my memory, I felt the Lord say, 'brush you hair'. I have no problems. Then lately I sort of relaxed a little. Then I got locked out of the office and had to call for help. Last night I locked myself out of my classroom before class and had to call for help. So, it's back to brushing!! That's my antidote for the month. I'll be away to a family graduation in May but Jan will be here.
